INSTRUCTIONAL COACH-TEACHER ON SPECIAL ASSIGNMENT (TOSA): Professional Development and California State Standards Implementation

BASIC FUNCTION:

Under direction of the Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services, the Instructional Coach-Teacher on Special Assignment (TOSA) will work with teachers and administrators to provide leadership, guidance and support in effective instructional practices in the District's implementation of California Common Core State Standards (CCSS). The TOSA will assist in the site Leadership Team to foster professional learning communities using data teams, classroom walk-through, peer observation, and action research. The Instructional Coach will also assist teachers in developing, testing, and implementing research based instructional strategies that will increase student achievement, as well as facilitating the use, analysis, and reflection of formative assessment data to improve teaching and student learning.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS AND ASSIGNED RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Provide modeling, coaching, team-teaching, and demonstrating of effective instruction in support of pedagogical shifts related to the implementation of CCCSS
- Assist teachers and administrators in analyzing summative and formative assessment data that will inform instructional practices
- Conduct research in curriculum, assessment and instructional practices related to California Common Core State Standards in all content areas and provide guidance in planning professional development and support to teachers and administrators
- Assist teachers and administrators in developing student achievement goals responsive to the needs of all students, especially low-income, English learners, and foster youth
- Plan, provide leadership for, and facilitate committee, task force, and stakeholder group meetings
- Support the identification and selection of Essential Standards, and advocate for high standards that define expectations for all student learning
- Provide leadership in the development of curriculum maps/scope and sequence
- Support the identification and selection of instructional materials
- Support teachers in the use of online tools for the sharing of resources, lessons, units, etc.
- Assist with coordination of academic intervention including assessment, materials, training, and scheduling
- Develop and maintain collaborative relationships
- Complete other duties and responsibilities as assigned by the Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services
